**Result of Brawl, But He Exonerates
Fellow Prisoner.**

Vernon, B. C., July 14.—Leo Muller, a German interned at the Vernon camp, died Saturday afternoon from injuries sustained in a brawl with Carl Wagner, a fellow prisoner, early in the week. Muller, who lived in Vancouver and Rossland before his internment as an alien enemy, in an ante-mortem statement, exonerated Wagner from blame.
