

# JUDGMENT HAS BEEN RESERVED IN CASE OF BISHOP BUDKA

## Charges Were Failure to Register as Enemy Alien and Report Monthly

---

WINNIPEG, Oct. 28.—Judgement was reserved by Judge Patterson in the case of Bishop Budka when the trial was brought to a close today. The charges pressed against the bishop were failure to register as an enemy alien and to report once monthly. Two witnesses were called today to prove the good character of the Austrian prelate. G. S. Sykwarck, M. A., director of the Ruthenians educational institute, St. Boniface, testified to the loyalty and patriotism of the defendant, and R. Kraemer, stated that the bishop had done considerable recruiting for the Ruthenian forestry detachment.
