STRICT IN REGARD TO NATURALIZATION

USTICE LOGIE

Questions Applicants Closely
-Half of Them Were Refused At the sitting of the Supreme Court

of Ontario, held here yesterday with

Mr. Justice Logic Presiding, a new procedure was adopted in connection with the naturalization of aliens for which His Honor should be highly

commended.
Eight aliens applied for naturalization, and these Justice Logid ques-tioned rather closely in regard to Eng-lish and Canadian politics. They were

compelled to answer queries as to who was the king of England, the

who was the king of England. the Premier of Canada, of Outarlo, the lo-cal members of Parliament, the capi-tals of England, Canada and Ontario. ctc. As a result thilf of those who applied were refused nationalization, the judge remarking that before they

could become citizens they would

could become citizens they would have to be better acquainted with English and Canadian conditions, and have an idea of the politics of the country. He advised those who were turned down to attend night school and acquire the necessary knowledge before again applying for the privileg-

es of citizenship.

The court opened at 2 o'block yesterday afternoon and the only case heard was that of Adelard Roy. Ver-

sus Mrs. Nellie L. Charnock and Mrs. Rose, for specific performance of agreement in connection with the sale of land. Mr. V. McNamara ap-peared for plaintiff and Messrs. Mc-

Innis & Brien for defendant. Judg-ment was given for plaintiff that specific performance of agreement be carried out, the plaintiff being awarded \$100 damages and high court costs.

The first case on the docket today is that of Charles Beck vs. Wm. Jones. as nation to recover possession of lots 208 and 209 in the Carrick Park Sub-division, defendant having de-faulted in payments under an agree-ment made August 1, 1918. This cease will be followed by that of David

Kankkunen vs. the Township of Korah, an action for \$2,000 for alleged injuries received in an accident in ed injuries received in an accident in Korah township when the car driven by plaintiff, was damaged and he him-celf injured. Messrs McFadden & Mc-Millan appeared for the plaintiff, and Mr. J. McEwen is conducting the de-Tepce.
