turers and agitators. The Star says the Reds decided to take action in a One Big Union or Bolshevist way last spring, but inter-

nal dissension finally broke up this plan. Large sums of money, however, have been raised to assist the ringleaders now under trial at Winnipeg. This was done by the sale of

what was known as "liberty bonds."

Money is now being raised by dances and other ways. The newspaper says that the Reds are now trying to undermine the la-bor unions, while women are 'planted' in factories to sow discon-

tent. Sinister tales are told of the Russian technical aid body, which

spec'alizes, it is claimed, on engines of destruction. In conclusion, the Star claims that Alexander Berkman and Emma Goldman, anarchists, were deported from the United States on informa-

tion secured in Montreal, and that the government will adopt the same policy toward local Reds.
