

ALIEN ENEMIES NO LONGER HAVE TO REPORT TO POLICE

Can Now Travel at Will —
Takes a Lot of Work from
Police Department

After a steady grind for five years dealing with alien enemies, the police department of the city has been relieved of the work of looking after these men as all orders-in-council requiring enemy aliens to register monthly and to obtain permission from the police when they wish to leave the city, are rescinded. During the time the orders-in-council were in force the police had from 1,500 to 2,000 alien enemies to look after monthly, which has entailed a great deal of work. A complete record has been kept of each man by the police department, and the man has been requested to carry a card showing the time of his arrival in the city and in the Dominion, the port of entry, his age and occupation, and whenever he desired to leave the city it has been necessary for the holder of the card to get permission from the chief of police. During the war this system was a great help in keeping these men at work, when labor was most needed.
