CANADA DEPORTS ALIEN RADICALS

Without Fuss or Flourish, Dominion Has Shipped Hundreds of Radicals Across

Atlantic.

MONTREAL, Jan. 20 (Canadian Press) .- Lieut.-Col. W. E. Date, commandant of the camp for alien enemies at Kapuskasing, back here on furlough, stated yesterday that while the United States newspapers had made much ado about a shipment of several hundred "Reds" to Europe. the Canadian government had been carrying on this work quietly but effect.vely for over a year past. During the past year well over a thousand alien enemies had been shipped from Canada and more were yet to go. They included Austrians and Germans chiefly, and a certain number of Russians. These parties were sent under guard to Rotterdam or other ports from which easy access could be secured to Central European points.

About one hundred of the Winnipeg "Reds" had been thus deported. They had been gathered in during the troubles at Winnipeg last June by the Royal Northwest Mounted Police and sent in batches to Kapuskasing, whence they were shipped across the Atlantic.

Lieut.-Col. Date said there were at present only about one hundred alien enemies at Kapuskasing, together with a few hundred in camps in other parts of the country who would be sent home at the earliest opportunity.
