RETURN MONEY TO ALIENS INTERNED DURING WAR

Some Earned Substantial Sums During Their Imprisonment

OTTAWA, Sept. 28.—Active measures are now being taken in the return to alien enemies, interned during the war but not deported, of property, securities and money taken from them and still held.

During the war a large number of alien enemies were interned at various camps throughout Canada, such as Fort William, Kapuskasing, Amherst, N. S. and Vernon, B. C. Shortly after the armistice these camps were discontinued and the prisoners were either released or returned to their native country. While the war was in progress operations were carried on in the camps under the administration of the department of justice. In many

cases prisoners were employed at var-

ious kinds of manual labor and earned

substantial sums.
