The Shevchenko Foundation is pleased to announce the appointment of Michelle Loughery to the Endowment Council of the Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund.

Michelle Loughery is the internee descendant representative. Her great grandfather and great uncle were interned in Banff/Castle Mountain internment camps. She is an award-winning international muralist who uses a unique approach to creating large-scale free hand public art installations that bring capacity building, communication, education and healing opportunities to communities. Notable pieces include the Vernon Mural Project, the Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame Mural Project, the Sunflower Project and the Route 66 Mural City Project. She is a recipient of the BC Achievement award and currently working on a digital art connection project called AR.T ROUTE BLUE.
