

Bulgarians Angry With Their King

*Over a Hundred Registered—
Much Work En-
tailed*

The work of registering the Bulgarians is proceeding apace at the office of the Registrar of Alien Enemies at 34 Adelaide street east. Over a hundred were registered yesterday. Detective Murray and Plain-clotheman Heas being occupied from nine o'clock in the morning until ten o'clock last night in dealing with this number. When they closed their books for the night the hall outside the office was crowded with over fifty Bulgarians who still had to be attended to. They were sent away and asked to come to-day. The work of registering the Bulgarians takes up some time. Apart from the fact that there is no Bulgarian interpreter at the office yet and the officers in charge have great difficulty in securing information from the foreigners, it must be remembered that the particulars and description of each man has to be written down five times; on two undertakings, one register, one card and one reporting book.

In addition to this the officers have to attend to the various Germans, Austrians, Hungarians and Turks who come in to report. These number at least several hundred each day. Detective Murray states that all the Bulgarians he has interviewed so far are wroth with King Ferdinand for throwing in his

lot with the Huns. The police are of the opinion that they will have less trouble with the Bulgarians than with any of the other alien enemies.
