

BARRACKS CROWDED BY ALIEN ENEMIES

Further Accommodation Will Have to be Found in Case of More Arrests

REGISTRATION FLOURISHING

Talk Every Language Except Chinese; Another Profes- sor Registers

There was room for just four more alien enemies at Stanley Barracks last night. There was room for none at noon to-day, as four Austrians were arrested. Further accommodation will be found.

The publication of 2,000 notices in English and German ordering the immediate registration of all alien enemies within a radius of twenty miles from Toronto City Hall, has brought a flood of business to the office of the registrar at 34 Adelaide street east.

Eighty registrations were made yesterday. The office was kept open till seven o'clock, and even then some were turned away unexamined.

The ante-chamber was crowded to-day. "And you have to talk to them in every language except Chinese," said Captain Wandlass, assistant registrar. "Even to get their names," added the interpreter.

Professor Von Lubgow, a graduate of Cambridge University, registered to-day. He has served his full term of service and is not liable for further military service in the German army.

Professor Bensinger has not yet registered.
