That is Decision Reached by
the Registrar of Alien
Enemies

IS REQUIRED TO REPORT

Response to Warnings Issued
and Posted in Prominent
Places

Seventy-seven alien enemies registered yesterday. In the churches where these people congregate notices were given out on Sunday warning those who had not registered that they must do so at once, under penalty of internment. A number of notices also to this effect have been posted in prominent places, evidently with the desired result.

He Is a German.

James Fairbrother, is a German, according to decision of Mr. A. J. Russell Snow, K. C., Registrar of Alien Enemies, though Mr. Fairbrother complained that he "could not be more English if he tried." He

was born in Hamburg, of a German mother and English father and he was also educated there, though he has been in Canada with the rest of the family for twelve years.

It went against the grain even to come down to the office of the Registrar of Alien Enemies to know if he needed to register he said, but he has not replied to the Registrar's letter, so his next attendance may be even more against the grain.
