

EMPLOYMENT BUREAU NEEDS INTERPRETER

Ald. Singer Points Out an Instance Where an Injustice Was Done

SEVERAL COMPLAINTS MADE

Board of Control Will Consider Matter—Form of the Estimates

Ald. Singer moved in the City Council yesterday that an interpreter be added to the staff of the Civic Employment Bureau.

"Five people have come to me today at different hours claiming discrimination where there was none," said the Alderman, "because mistakes had been made at the bureau through inability to speak other than English by the officers."

One man, Mr. Singer mentioned, had not been given work because he was understood to say that he had a wife in Russia when he meant that he had no wife and children.

Alderman McBride objected to dealing with the question without the consideration of the Board of Control.

It was referred to the Board.
