## Ludwig Henry Nerlich Enters Name With Registrar of Aliens

---

### CLAIMS TO BE BRITISH

---

## Special Consideration Ordered for Some Turkish Subjects

---

Ludwig Henry Nerlich, brother of Emil Nerlich, held on a charge of treason and arrested last Saturday, registered in the office of alien enemies yesterday. While he promised to report monthly on the 26th, he added a foot note to the form, declaring:—

"I have always believed and now believe that I am a British subject. My first passport was granted to me by the British Consul in Dresden, Germany, but in case of any doubt as to the same, I am making this declaration."

He says he has never served in the German Army. He gave his address as 78 Chestnut Park road and his occupation as "a merchant."

### The Sultan's Subjects.

Instructions were received in the office of the Registrar of Alien Enemies to-day informing him that by special British Order-in-Council favor was to be given to Turkish subjects shown, to the satisfaction of the registration officer, to be by race Greeks, Armenians or Syrians, as members of a community well-known to be opposed to the Turkish regent—favor in the way of all reasonable facilities for traveling permits and so on. There are probably about 100 such Turkish subjects on the books of the local Registrar at 24 Adelaide west.

While particulars are taken in such cases the men are not required to report, though one, an Armenian, has been interned. He was taken at the House of Industry asking assistance with money in his pocket. He said his wife was in Armenia and that he hated the Turks as they had massacred his children. He was sent to Stanley Barracks and has since been transferred to Petawara.
