

German Dynamiter Smiles Upon Women

Starts for County Jail to Serve Thirty Days for Damage to Vanceboro

Vanceboro, Me., Feb. 5.—Werner Horn, who claims to be a German officer, and in that capacity to have tried to blow up the International Bridge here, was removed to Machias today to serve a sentence of thirty days for the damage which the explosion caused on this side of the border.

Deputy Sheriff George W. Ross put his prisoner aboard the train leaving for Bangor at 9.45 o'clock. At Bangor, after a wait of two hours, the trip will be continued on another line east to Machias where the party is due at 6.20 o'clock this evening.

The departure of Horn, who has gained notoriety by what he calls his act of war against Great Britain, attracted little attention. A small crowd of men and women gathered at the station. The prisoner, who was not shackled, smiled upon the women and waved a good-bye as the train drew out. The case is now ended so far as the state is concerned.

The next move it is expected will be by the federal authorities who are concerned with the application for the extradition of the dynamiter to Canada, where he is wanted to answer for the little damage which he did to the bridge by operating on that side of the boundary line.
