
WALKER FUNERAL TO-DAY.

Private Burial Services to Be Held at His Residence.

Windsor, March 14.—Simple funeral rites will be held at Walkerville to-morrow for Edward Chandler Walker, President of Hiram Walker & Sons, distillers, who died in Washington last Wednesday. Services will be held at 3 p.m. from "Willstead," Mr. Walker's residence in Walkerville. Interment will be made in the churchyard of St. Mary's Episcopal Church, founded and built by Mr. Walker and his brothers.

The body left Washington Friday, and arrived here yesterday. This afternoon it lay in state in the big mansion, guarded by soldiers from the 21st Regiment, of which Mr. Walker was Honorary Colonel. Rev. W. H. Battersby, rector of St. Mary's Church, will conduct the services, and burial will be private.

Eight men long identified with the Walker interests in Walkerville will bear the body to the grave. They are: Walter Chater, Arthur Ellis, J. A. McDougall, Edward Ladore, Robert Daniels, S. C. Robinson and F. H. Cooper.

CAR ROBBERY CHARGES.

Edwin C. Coulthurst Arrested and Remanded For a Week.

Bridgeburg, March 14.—The first arrest of the number expected on car robbery charges was made yesterday morning. Edwin C. Coulthurst, thirty-two years old, was arraigned before Magistrate House and remanded for a week. He is a son of Edwin Coulthurst, the Deputy Returning Officer for the Canada temperance act election, who was indicted by the Grand Jury on three counts for alleged illegal acts in connection with the taking of the vote two years ago.

AUSTRIAN IS ARRESTED.

Windsor, March 14.—Two men were found in the G.T.R. yards here Friday night acting in a suspicious manner and they were placed under arrest. Yesterday morning in the Police Court one of the men admitted he was an Austrian, and was turned over to the military authorities, who will send him to a detention camp. There have been more than 75 alien enemies caught in this city by the police and immigration authorities since the war started.
