

WILD, INSANE RUSSIAN CELEBRATES PRZEMYSL

"Indeed, he is," stated Inspector Geddes, "for yesterday, in the full light of day, he stripped off every rag of clothing and stood on Church street shouting.

"Bow down, bow down, slaves—!" began the wild-eyed Russian again, in a loud voice.

He was remanded a week, to be examined by the jail doctors. And after he had gone down the iron stairway to the cells, he could still be heard exhorting the slaves to bow before Holy Russia, yelling in frenzy.
