

ABUSED PRIVILEGES AND IS NOW INTERNED

Paul Jokel Tried to Leave Country on Liberation From Prison

Another German who abused the privileges granted him in this country got his deserts to-day when Paul Jokel, a Hun, who while admitting that his father was a German, claimed that he himself had been born in Belgium, was taken before the Chief of Police, Registrar of Aliens, and ordered to be interned at Fort Henry. Jokel is a young man of very neat appearance who speaks English well, but with a distinct German accent. He appeared in the Police Court to-day on a nominal charge of vagrancy and was taken charge of by Detective Maurer, who attends to alien enemies.

According to Inspector Kennedy, Jokel was arrested in Toronto a few days after war broke out in a munition factory, where he was employed. He was interned at Stanley Barracks, but escaped. He was arrested shortly afterwards and taken to Hamilton to face a charge of forgery and theft, for which he was sentenced to a year in the Central Prison. On his release a short while ago he obtained employment in a well-known wholesale house on Spadina avenue as chief clerk. While endeavoring to make his escape from Canada he was again arrested. He will be looked after until the end of the war.
