

Alien Enemies Build Park Roads

Many American Tourists Visit the Beauty Spot in Canadian Rockies

"Some 400 German prisoners of war will be utilized by the Federal Government in building roads in Jasper park," remarked Fred. H. Brewster, who is in Winnipeg, enroute to New York.

"The wire entanglement was being put up last week and the interned Germans will arrive shortly and commence cleaning the fallen timber. Maligne lake, the prettiest and largest lake in the Canadian Rockies, is about thirty miles south of Jasper on the Canadian Northern transcontinental line. This is a favorite mountain jaunt of tourists on saddle ponies. The motor road to this lake will be one of the finest in America. With German labor to build the road, the government will only need to supply teams, tools and foremen.

Many Tourists Coming

Mr. Brewster stated that since the Canadian Northern Railway had connected with Vancouver, tourists from the United States have flocked to Jasper park. About ninety per cent. of the people who have enjoyed the beauties of the National park are from across the border. The hunting is especially fine in Jasper, and sportsmen come from the eastern states in large numbers to bag the grizzly bears and grey mountain sheep.
