

***Internment Camp Guards Leave  
For Special Duty at Jasper Park***

# Major A. E. Hopkins Names List of Officers Under His Command

Twenty-five guards under Lieut. A. C. Bury and Lieut. G. Hill left the city last night for Jasper park internment camp to prepare for the reception of the alien prisoners of war who will probably be located at the camp next week.

Major Hopkins, camp commandant, this morning announced his officers. Lieut. A. C. Bury will be adjutant; H. R. Mountfield and G. Hill will be lieutenants and Sergt. Major. Hawkesworth of the 19th Alberta Dragoons will be sergeant major.

The commandant, Major Hopkins, has had a lengthy military career in Canada. He was three years with the Canadian permanent forces and from 1893 to 1904 was a member of the R.N.W. Mounted Police. Since 1906 he has been with the 19th Alberta dragoons and for five years was adjutant of that unit. Since September 1914 he has been commanding officer of the 19th, helped raise two service squadrons, conducted a provisional school for cavalry officers and N.C.O.'s and later gave very material assistance to Col. McKinery in the recruiting and organization of the 66th Battalion. He holds his field officer's certificate.

Lieut. Bury has had ten years military experience and has just been admitted as a barrister in this city. Lieut. Mountfield was with the 63rd Battalion. Lieut. Hill has been with the 101st Edmonton Fusiliers for a year. Sergt. Maj. Hawkesworth is fully qualified for his position.
