John Wolert, a German, who was arrested by the immigration authorities some months ago, and who has twice escaped from custody, is busily giving interviews to Seattle papers, and telling moving stories of his skilful methods of eluding his captors. R. dining car, and interned because of his speechmaking proclivities and the facilities he had, through his occupation, to communicate with Germans on both sides of the boundary line, Wolert claims to have climbed an eight foot fence at the detention camp at Nanaimo and made for the United States, where he was turned over to the Canadian officials, but again managed to make his getaway, his guard sustaining a broken leg in an attempt to follow his prisoner in a thrilling jump from a moving train.
