

Detained Germans Escape, Caught at Magrath After an Exciting Chase

Fritz Rapp, the lusty Hun warrior, who was captured by the city police some months ago, and turned over to the military authorities as a prisoner-of-war, was too slippery for the guards at the military prison, and on Friday evening escaped with a pal.

The exact method he used is not known, but he and his partner failed to answer to their names at the evening roll call. The two men made for the south, and after an exciting search

on the part of the battery boys, and the Mounted Police, Constable Craig of the Magrath detachment R.N.W.M. P., rounded the two Germans up in the southern town.

During the search, Sergeant-Major Judson, who recently transferred from the detention camp, where he was in charge, to the 20th Battery, turned up missing. Fearing that he had met with some serious mishap, Major Stewart ordered out a large detach-

ment yesterday morning, 75 mounted men being engaged in the search.

The prairie between here and Magrath was combed thoroughly, and towards evening Sergeant-Major Judson was found in the Pot-Hole, where his horse had played out.

The two prisoners were brought back to the city, and are again behind the barbed-wire. Rapp is a lieutenant in the German landwehr, and is considered a prize catch.
