

THREE GERMANS ARE SENT TO BRANDON

That German spies were among the passengers of the ill-fated Lusitania is pretty well established. The danger of Germans resident in Canada escaping to the United States and conveying information as to the disposition and movements of Canadian troops is engaging the earnest attention of the military authorities, and the guards along the border have been strengthened.

Three Germans were arrested in Winnipeg yesterday and will be sent to the internment camp at Brandon as undesirables. Although they admitted that they had seen the announcement that all Germans should register before April 15, under penalty of being interned, they had neglected to do so. The number of prisoners of war at Brandon is now 325, the majority of whom, however, are Austrians, sent there because they
