

# HOME GUARDS HAVE NO TROUBLE WITH PRISONERS

Since Taking Over Guarding of  
Aliens Here 99th Have Had  
No Trouble

## MANY MORE PRISONERS

Are Now in Winter Fair Arena  
Than Ever Before — Daily  
Arrivals

Not a single attempt to escape has been made by the interned aliens since the work of guarding them has been taken over by the 99th battalion. Although only reorganized on June 4th the regiment took over the guard on June 17th, and according to the officers the prisoners have behaved like lambs.

Most of the officers of the regiment have enlisted for overseas service, some with the 45th and others with the 79th, and those who have not enlisted are in training at Winnipeg in preparation for appointments abroad.

Many of the men of the regiment are transferring to the 79th, so that the guard regiment is practically becoming a training corps for men before they enlist for overseas.

Prisoners are being brought in steadily and the number interned in the winter fair building now reaches 900, and the available space is pretty well filled up. Every day the prisoners are taken out twice under escort and marched out to the prairie, where surrounded by their escort they are allowed to get outdoor exercise. On Sunday clergymen of their own nationality come occasionally to hold services with the prisoners.

Outside the fair building the members of the guard have a pet red fox, mascot of the regiment. The animal is getting quite tame and accustomed to the petting given by the men of the regiment.
