

# RETURNED SOLDIERS SIGN UP AS GUARDS AT JASPER PARK

## Construction Work Is Making Good Headway Despite Cold Weather

Twenty-five returned soldiers were signed up Friday night for service as guards at the internment camp which will be established at Jasper in the immediate future. There are still vacancies for between thirty-five and forty men and in every instance preference will be given to soldiers returned from the front. Many of the men invalided home through wounds or illness have recovered sufficiently to undertake the less vigorous duties at the internment camp and in this way satisfactory employment will be found for several of them.

Construction work at Jasper is making good headway despite the cold weather and it is expected that the camp buildings will be ready for occupancy next Saturday. At the commencement 200 alien enemies will be interned there. They are to be brought from the Brandon camp.

Returned soldiers wishing to go to the camp as guards are requested to report to B. F. Blackburn, secretary of the Returned Soldiers' bureau. His offices are located opposite the post-office.
