

WINNIPEG AUSTRILIANS LEAVE FOR THE FRONT

Arrangements Being Made To Charter Special Transport from C. N. R.

WINNIPEG, July 30.—The official proclamation of the partial mobilization order issued by the government of Austria-Hungary is published in Winnipeg today in "The Ukrainian Voice," and other papers of the nationalities concerned.

The men concerned in the mobilization are being informed by announcement cards in addition to the mobilization order. The order promises that expenses of travelling will be paid.

The proclamation promises a full amnesty to all those who will immediately return home. This embraces those who are considered as deserters and who did not show up for conscription.

It is very difficult to obtain any information regarding the number of Serbians in Western Canada, although orders of mobilization have been issued to them. There are not many Serbs in Winnipeg, but Moose Jaw and Regina number quite a few among their cosmopolitan population.

Sixty North Winnipeg Austrians leave for the fighting front next Wednesday. Their tickets have been purchased as far as Montreal. At that port they will be mobilized by the consul general of Austria, who is arranging, it is said, with the Canadian Northern for the charter of a special transport steamer.
