

AUSTRIAN ARRESTED

Boarding Train at Transcona on Way Home When Taken.

With a permit, signed apparently by an official of the labor department of the emigration office, allowing him passage to New York, William Durko, an Austrian reservist was arrested yesterday in Transcona, just prior to his boarding a train in an attempt to leave the country, presumably to return to Austria for military duty.

Durko was turned over to the military authorities in Winnipeg, and is now detained at the Fort Osborne barracks. He has lived in Canada about 17 months, and is therefore not naturalized. He has worked for some time in Transcona, and latterly has been watched. The name attached to the permit, giving him permission to go to New York, is said to be that of a German.
