

**Accuses Foreigner, Is Himself Arrested.**—Although he first had a foreigner named Tony arrested for stealing a signed cheque from him, Thomas A. Scott was locked in the cells at the police station yesterday morning after two or three hundred dollars' worth of forged cheques had been found in his possession. On Saturday Scott entered the Exchange hotel and asked the manager to cash a cheque. The cheque did not look good to the manager, and he refused. Scott took the cheque outside and asked the man Tony to see if he could get it cashed, and Tony put it in his pocket and calmly walked away. Scott called a policeman, and as a result the accused and accuser were taken to the police station and searched. Only a few minor articles were found on the foreigner, while the cheques were found on the person of Scott. Scott appeared in police court yesterday afternoon, and was remanded until this morning, when it is expected that he will be released on suspended sentence. As far as could be learned, none of the cheques had been cashed, and as the former record of the prisoner is very good, it is expected that leniency will be permitted by the crown.
