

RESOLUTION AMENDED

Sir James Aikins suggested a modification in the resolution passed by the Canadian Club on Saturday on the subject of alleged aliens in the public service. Sir James' added explanation regarding the steps taken by the Dominion Government to protect Cana-

dian interests should have sufficed, and the rather clumsy resolution suggesting action along lines necessarily taken by Premier Borden, should have been dropped. Without good cause, it is a serious matter to reflect upon the activity or judgment of the Government in maintaining a loyal, reliant public service. The resolution in its original form could have no other effect, if we have confidence in the capacity of such men as Premier Borden and Hon. Arthur Meighen directly entrusted with protection from disloyalty within our borders, than to spread distrust and stir up alarm and feelings of apprehension among thousands of citizens of foreign birth or parentage who today are anxious to be regarded as what they really are, loyal subjects of the British Empire.
