

RUSH ALIENS TO BRANDON CAMP

All day there has been a big crowd round the alien registration offices at 112 Colony street. This is the last day on which names of un-naturalized Germans and Austrians will be accepted without the closest enquiry and risk of internment until the end of the war. At noon the total registration had reached 12,171.

Many of those who have registered during the past few days have but recently arrived from some small place where they had denned up for the winter and have now emerged like bears in the spring. "We shall have a group of men rounding up aliens tomorrow, starting bright and early," said H. H. Crofts, assistant registrar, today. Further than this Mr. Crofts would say nothing, but arrangements for increased accommodation have been made at the intern camp at Brandon.
