

Jockey Clubs to Use More Canadians

WINDSOR, Ont., Oct. 17.—Settlement of the question of employment of alien and Canadian workers on racing tracks in the Dominion, which has been agitated of late in Quebec and Ontario, has been reached as regards Kenilworth, whose second meeting was opened yesterday. At a conference between Messrs. Orpen and Millar, of the Kenilworth track, and Messrs. Mitchell and Reynolds, of the Dominion Immigration department, agreement was reached whereby the track owners are to give employment to fifteen more Canadians. Close to 500 applications were put in.
