

AGREES MUCH OF 'UNREST' STIRRED BY BRITISH-BORN

W. A. Shepard Says Veterans Will Go To Bottom of 'Alien' Situation

"We know that much of the unrest among aliens in the city is due to such men as F. J. Dixon, Alderman J. Queen and George Armstrong," said W. A. Shepard, secretary of the Army and Navy Veterans' association today.

He made the remark in comment on the statement of Theodore Stefanic, published in The Tribune. Mr. Stefanic blamed British-born agitators for stirring up any unrest there may be among foreign-born citizens residing in the north end.

"We know for a fact, but cannot understand that there are aliens who are in sympathy with our enemies. They would be unnatural if they were not, but this is not the place or the time for them to express their sympathies. But there is no excuse for British-born to stir up any unrest.

"We are going into this investigation to the end. There will be no let-up till we find the persons responsible for the unrest among foreigners in the city.

"The statement of Mike Scullen, yardmaster of the Canadian Pacific railway, that he has no Germans working for him is denied in a letter we have received from a contractor, who names three, one of whom is renting a barber shop, and is believed to be sending money to Germany, another who has charge of all the switches, and a third who is a car checker. We are investigating these statements."
