

13 ALIENS JAILED FOR RIOTING

Seven Others Face Trial In Provincial Court For Transcona Disorders

Thirteen of the 26 alien laborers responsible for disorders at the Government Elevator, Transcona, last Thursday, were sentenced to two months in jail with a fine of \$50 in addition, when they were arraigned before a special court this morning.

Five others were sent to an internment camp at Cochrane, Ont., Saturday. The remaining seven were tried in provincial police court this afternoon.

Labor officials today retained Attorney Hugh D. Cutler, to defend the seven men who will appear in civil court on disorderly and rioting charges.

The 13 men sentenced today are locked up in Manitoba provincial jail. A crowd of their relatives visited the Intelligence department offices in an attempt to get them freed with a fine.

The seven men for whom Attorney

Cutler will appear were freed on \$50 cash bail. A remand for one week was to be asked by the defense when they are arraigned.

Many of the laborers, who, as members of the Building Trades Laborers' union, struck for higher wages several weeks ago, had as much as \$500 in their pockets when they were arrested, military police declared. All wanted fines instead of going to jail.
