

EDITOR DENIES CHARGE OF SEDITION; LINGUISTS DELVE INTO NEWSPAPER

While pamphlets, correspondence and copies of his newspaper, "The Working People," alleged by the police to contain sedition, are being translated from the original Russian, Michael Charitinoff, 567 Selkirk ave., is out on \$1,000 bail.

He was arraigned today in city police court on a charge of sedition. He pleaded not guilty. The case will be heard next Friday. T. J. Murray is acting for Charitinoff.

Police Wednesday confiscated alleged seditious papers from Charitinoff's home. It is charged that some of the pamphlets are written by Russian Bolsheviks.

"The Working People" is a socialistic Russian paper. Editor Charitinoff works part time as a railway freight handler.
