

READY TO REGISTER MEN HERE

Returned Soldier Registers
Complaint Against Ger-
man Who "Stole" Wife

SITTING TO BE RESUMED
AT 10 O'CLOCK SATURDAY

The provincial board dealing with alien enemies is ready for registration. Necessary documents arrived this morning and citizens of enemy or foreign birth may now fill in papers at 185 Lombard st.

The preliminary sitting of the board, presided over by Judge Myers, opened at 10 o'clock this morning, and adjourned after a half-hour session. The sitting will be resumed Saturday. Accounts were passed and private business dealt with. The complaint of a returned soldier against a man of German origin was heard. The soldier was referred to the county court, in accordance with the order-in-council made public today.

In future the board will sit at 9.30 o'clock for preliminary business and will be open to the public from 10 o'clock on, it was announced.

Applications Arrive Here

Judge Myers, R. Sutherland, A. E. Moore, H. J. Mansfield were present at the session. Papers which arrived at the office include the application for certificate, cards issued to naturalize a British subject of one of the allied countries, of an enemy country and an unaturalized foreigner, who has proven to the satisfaction of the board, his loyalty.

The application for certificate requires the following information: Place of birth, parents country of birth, date of naturalization, occupation, age, language used in conversation, employment during war, members of family engaged in war work, amount invested in Victory bonds, amount paid to red cross and patriotic funds.

Recommendation of two citizens is required.

This application is considered by the board and if passed upon the applicant is presented with one of the cards, to which his picture is at-
