

60 AUSTRIANS SENT NORTH.

New Government Farm at Hearst, New Ontario, is Begun.

Ottawa, Dec. 15.—Sixty Austrian and German prisoners, who have been interned at Kingston, have left for Hearst, Ontario, where they will be placed at work on the new Government experimental farm.

Prof. J. F. Grisdale, director of Dominion experimental farms, has gone north to Hearst with a representative of the Ontario Agricultural Department and the land will be selected at once so that the men can be put at work clearing the new farm. They will sleep in the railway cars until bunks can be built. Several hundred more prisoners will be sent north as soon as arrangements are completed.

From Hearst, Prof. Grisdale will go to Kapuskasing, in Quebec, on the N. T. R., where the farm which the Quebec Government is giving will be located.
