

Much Work Done In Northern Bush

*Six Hundred Miles of New
Roads; Crops This Year
Were Good*

Nearly six hundred miles of roads, cut through virgin forests, is part of the year's work in Northern Ontario reported on by Commissioner J. G. Whitson. Despite the extent of the work done, however, the expenditure was only \$689,910, as compared with a total of \$2,076,823 for the two previous years.

In addition to 397 miles of new roads, 281 miles of grading and surfacing was done on new and old roads and 113 miles of old roads were partly graded or improved.

Another extensive operation was the building of a dam 450 feet in length across the Frederickhouse River to improve navigation on Night Hawk Lake and tributary streams.

Four experimental farms were in operation during the year, and according to Mr. Whitson no finer crops are to be seen anywhere in Ontario than those in some of the northern districts.
