

# AUSTRIANS TURNED ON THEIR GUARDS.

COCHRANE, Ont., May 15—One man dead, nine seriously wounded, several fatally, and four injured, is the result of an outbreak instigated by 300 Austrian prisoners, who arrived at Kapuskasing prison camp, sixty miles west of here on the Transcontinental railway, from Petawawa on Wednesday last under guard of 300 soldiers. The outbreak, in which the 900 other inmates of the camp participated, occurred on Friday, and the riot lasted several hours, the soldiers using their bayonets as well as firing on the prisoners. General Logie, commanding the Toronto district, is in camp conducting an investigation. The new arrivals who started the uprising and had already given considerable trouble at Petawawa, refused to go to work and turned on their guards. There were no casualties among the soldiers.
