

TRANSFER ALIENS FROM FORT HENRY

To the Internment Camp at
Kapusksing, Northern On-
tario.

OTTAWA, March 14—Arrangements are being completed for the immediate transfer of the enemy aliens interned at Fort Henry, Kingston, to the internment camp at Kapuskasing, in Northern Ontario. Fort Henry is to be used for military purposes and the prisoners can be more suitably looked after at Kapuskasing, where they will have open air healthful exercise in carrying on the work of clearing and cultivating land begun by the hundreds of Germans and Austrians who were sent there during the early months of the war.

Most of these latter are now voluntarily employed under surveillance as laborers in various parts of the Dominion. Several hundred of them have been sent to work in the coal and iron mines of Nova Scotia.

Sir Charles Davidson has completed six more chapters of his investigation of the past two years, into charges of irregularities in war purchasing in Canada. He has presented to the Minister of Justice six reports dealing with specific investigations conducted during 1915 and 1916. These reports will be considered by the Cabinet Council before they are given out for publication.
