**FORMER ENEMIES HAD
NEVER BEEN WEST BEFORE**

**Police Officials Already Quite
Busy Looking After Men Let
Out in Vernon.**

A number of former enemy aliens have been reporting at the city police station lately. It is reported that some of these men have been released from eastern internment camps and provided with transportation to British Columbia, where, in accordance with instructions from the officers commanding their former place of confinement, they have to report to the police.

Stories of a similar nature have been coming from Victoria, where a number of men have reported from the camp at Kapuskasing, Ont. These men state that never having been west before, and being offered free transportation to any point, they decided to come to British Columbia.

Local police officials say they have plenty to do looking after prisoners of war discharged from the internment camp at Vernon without keeping an eye on aliens exported from the east. Of late, these men from the eastern provinces have been reporting here in increasing numbers.
