

FORTY ITALIAN RESERVISTS LEFT THE SAULT TODAY.

At noon today a large assembly congregated at the C.P.R. depot, from the Italian colony in the west end of the city, the occasion being the departure of forty Italian reservists, who have been residents here, for their home in Italy.

They will be joined at Copper Cliff by another quota of men. Bookings have been made with an ocean-playing steamer, from Boston, for the whole party, by the Italian Royal Consular Agent here, William Grassi. The party proceeds at once to Boston, from whence they sail for Italy on Thursday.

Although Italy is not yet in a state of war all the reservists of the Italian army are being recalled from every point on the globe, trouble being expected in the peninsular monarchy.
