

# COLLECTED \$600 IN LIQUOR FINES AT POLICE COURT

## Good List of Cases Came Before Magistrate for Trial

In the police court yesterday Frank Dzama and Alex Komichuk appeared for a breach of the Ontario Temperance Act. In his defence Dzama said that five one-gallon tins of liquor, in a valise, were placed in his buggy Sunday night in Bay View by an unknown person in an auto, who said "Take my valise." Accused had no idea who the man was, and was not aware that there was liquor in the valise. The police investigated the valise before defendant reached home. He was found guilty and fined \$200 and costs. Komichuk was discharged.

John Niemi also appeared for violation of the act, on Aug. 20. He said two men came up from Sudbury in an auto and stayed at his house. The police found four one-gallon tins of alcohol on the premises, and John was assessed \$400 and costs or five months.

James Heaney was fined \$10 and costs for being drunk.

V. Iamanowicz, an Austrian prisoner of war, broke his parole and went to the Michigan Soo. He admitted it and was fined \$25 and costs or 30 days.

John Nelson was charged with the theft of a bicycle valued at \$25 from the custody of the police, who recovered it. Sentence was suspended.

Fleet McLean was charged with assault upon Adam Euler, on August 23. The magistrate held that accused was within his legal rights in ejecting Euler from the Hiawatha premises, but probably used too much force. McLean will pay any medical expenses incurred by Euler as a result of the incident.

Ernesto Gerardi allowed a cow to run at large, pleaded guilty, and paid \$5 and costs.
