

TO BE IN COMMAND.

Lieut.-Col. Lennox Irving Sent To Petawawa.

Pembroke, Jan. 21.—Lieut.-Col. Lennox Irving has been appointed commandant of the Petawawa internment camp, to succeed Lieut.-Col. S. E. de la Ronde, who has held that position since the camp opened about sixteen months ago. Col. de la Ronde is to be given another office, that of camp superintendent. Col. Irving's duties will start immediately. Col. Irving is a lawyer by profession, having graduated from Queen's University in the eighties. He has lived in Pembroke all his life and is one of the best known figures. There are about 700 Austrians interned at Petawawa with a guard of about 150 men from the 42nd Regiment, under Capt. Edwards, looking after them.
