

About twenty foreigners, mostly Hungarians and Austrians, were brought from the internment camp at Petawawa on Monday to work in the lumber mills here, thus filling to some extent the shortage of men and lessening the expenses on the state, for as prisoners the country had to pay for their maintenance. The government is adopting the plan of allowing the best of the alien prisoners their freedom when their services are thus required and sending the obdurate and troublesome ones to Spirit Lake and Kapuskasing, in northern Ontario, that Petawawa camp may be made ready for a large number of troops.—Arnprior Chronicle.
