

Bunch Of Trespassers On G.T.R.

--How The Immigration Officers Act

Canadian, Russian, and Bulgarian were the nationalities of six men whom G.T. Inspector Ashby discovered dodging about the dark corners of the Grand Trunk freight yard last night, with the obvious intent of crossing the border without transport and in defiance of the immigration laws. The Canadians were easily disposed of. These were David Hetherton, a married man, 22 years of age, and Albert Whitoyton, 31, also married, both laborers and both from Toronto. They were not quite "without visible means of subsistence," but they were without sufficient to comply with the requirements of the Immigration Department. Hence their obvious attempt to cross as freight. These Canadians were shown befitting leniency, sentence being deferred, but they could not be allowed to violate the immigration laws. They must find work in their own country meanwhile.

Innis Yateff, aged 19, and Dobre Petroff, 23, both Bulgarians, and both laborers from Thorold, were also arrested last night, trespassing with like

intention of quitting in freight trains. Innis and Dobri not being acceptable over the river under present conditions, were, like their Canadian brothers in misfortune, called upon to pay small costs and go in search of work. The same fate befel a Russian named Stiff Consono, who had gone through from Milton to the United States side. There the officials of the States found it necessary to provide him with a ticket to go back to Milton, but, believing no work awaited him in Milton, he joined the bunch, and was dealt with this morning as they were.

Ray, Laveck, 24 years of age, was also among them. His papers showed he was born in Bellfountain, Ohio, and was endeavoring to smuggle through to Canada, having heard that as a factory hand he would find work over here. The law compels, however, and Ray Laveck was ordered to be deported. He has gone in the opposite direction to that his companions in trouble have taken, and is on his way back to his birthplace, unless he is trying some new adventure on the other side of the river.
