

# POLES AT DEPEW TO ASSIST FELLOW-COUNTRYMEN.

At a meeting yesterday in Depew funds were raised for the relief of Polish widows and orphans, victims of the European war. At another meeting in St. Stanislaus Church, Peckham street and Fillmore avenue, a committee was appointed to carry on similar work.

The Depew gathering was in SS. Peter and Paul Church Hall, under the auspices of the Polish National Alliance, the Polish Roman Catholic Fe-

deration, the Polish Falcons, and the Polish Union of America.

The Rev. M. Helminiak emphasized the fact now is the time to assist the needy ones in Europe, and the considerable sum collected will be remitted to Europe.

A throng responded to the call issued by the Rev. Alexander Pittas, pastor of St. Stanislaus Church. The meeting was in the Church Hall. A local committee of the Polish National Council was organized. Father Pittas presided, and Henry Klimek, editor of the Polish Daily News, acted as secretary.

It was decided to commence soliciting funds at once for the benefit of the Polish sufferers in Europe. The

money collected will remain in the treasurer's hands until headquarters of the Polish National Council in Chicago states to whom it should be sent in Europe. To encourage the workers Father Pittas gave \$100, which caused the large assembly to respond with similar amounts.
