

Twenty-three Austrian and German Prisoners Taken This Morning

G. T. Waiting Room as Lock-up.

Gentlemen passengers wishing to book at the Grand Trunk Station this morning met with a rude rebuff upon attempting to enter the men's waiting room, and booking office, a group of three or four soldiers, members of the 44th Regiment, being stationed at the door with fixed bayonets. Inside the waiting-room were imprisoned twenty-three aliens, comprising Austrians and Germans, who have been detained at the Armories, having attempted to book passages for Europe.

The whole party of prisoners, in charge of eight of the 44th's best men, were dispatched off this morning by 9.30 train to Sunnyside, and will probably be conveyed thence to Kingston.

This successful haul on the part of the Immigration Department, following upon their big haul of some weeks ago, comprising between thirty and forty of these aliens, is another proof of their vigilance in preventing intending recruits reaching Europe to swell the tide of the allies' enemies.
