

# *German Reservists Make Much Trouble*

## *Efforts of a Number to Leave Canada Keeps Police on Look-out*

In addition to the work created for the police by the German and Austrian reservists who endeavor to leave Canada to join their old regiments now fighting with the enemy in Europe, trouble has been given by several arrivals, of recent date, from the United States, who are apparently trying to quicken the desire of Germans living here to get back to their native land to assist the Kaiser's forces.

On Saturday afternoon twenty Germans and Austrians, who had been detained at Niagara Falls when trying to get across the boundary, were brought to Toronto and placed in Stanley Barracks. Among them were two men, German reservists, who had passed their word that they would not attempt to leave the country.

Detectives arrested two Germans on Saturday in a city store, who were purchasing cameras and other supplies. German papers a month old were found on them, one of which contained an article to the effect that the German cruisers Goeben and Breslau, which had been given harbor at Constantinople were still manned by German crews and intended attacking the Russian ships in the Black Sea.

According to the police, letters from Germany, found in the rooms of Germans resident here, convey the information to army reservists that it is easy to leave the United States by way of Philadelphia.
