

EXPLOSION IS LAID TO FOREIGN AGENTS

Inquiry Into Dynamiting is
Made in Niagara Falls,
N.Y.

Niagara, Falls, N.Y., Feb. 12.—No arrests have yet been made in connection with the attempt to blow up the plant of the Castner Electrolytic Alkali Company, here last night. The explosion, which was in a new building under construction, shattered many windows and slightly damaged the walls. No one was injured. The police found several sticks of dynamite concealed under one of the concrete walls. The company it is said had large contracts with the Allies for certain chemicals used in the war zone. There is no labor trouble at the plant and the police are working on the theory that the explosion was the work of foreign agents.

United States secret service men, who have been in this vicinity several days, are co-operating with the local authorities.
