

# HAVE ENTERED PROTEST

AGAINST A GERMAN WHO IS  
MADE A REGISTRAR.

The Alien Question Was Discussed  
at a Meeting Held on Sunday—  
The Government Should Not Heed  
the Aliens With Offices.

There was an enthusiastic meeting of the Civil and Military Vigilance Committee of Kingston last night. The important question of funds with which to carry on the work of the committee was dealt with. Hitherto voluntary contributions were depended upon, but it was felt that owing to the volume and growing importance of the work the various labor bodies and the Veterans' Associations should be asked to make specific grants proportionate to their representation and this was agreed to. The alien question drew forth prolonged discussion, and there was general dissatisfaction over the privileges allowed the aliens who, it was stated, are employed in our industries and even in Government offices. The employment of aliens in Government offices was condemned. The appointment of Dr. Haentschel as registrar of Canadian man power for the district of Temiskaming called forth a protest from the Cobalt branch of the G.W.V.A. The reception of the protest by Senator Robertson, chairman of the Registration Board, and the statement made by him as reported in the press, was discussed, and the committee decided to back up the G.W.V.A. of Cobalt by sending a telegram to the Governor-General as well as to Senator Robertson protesting against the appointment of Dr. Haentschel.

T. Moore, who represents the Allied labor bodies of Canada at the international convention now being held at St. Paul, has been telegraphed to support the protest sent to the Registration Board at Ottawa. Mr. Moore is the labor representative on the board.

It is alleged that Dr. Haentschel is a German, but how the Government came to appoint him and who recommended him for appointment to a position is a mystery that Senator Robertson will be called upon to explain.
