

# PRISONERS OF WAR

## Fifteen German Members of C. P. R. Steamer's Crew Arrested.

Montreal, Aug. 12.—Fifteen members of the crew of the C.P.R. steamer Mount Royal, firemen and stokers, who are reservists in the Germany navy, were made prisoners of war today by Lieutenant Fisher and a squad of men. The police acted under instructions from Chief Campeau. The Germans were marched from the ship to police headquarters, where they were locked up.

It has not been decided as yet what will be done with them. Those who are willing to sign a parole, that they will not take any part in the present conflict in Europe, or in any way assist the enemies of Great Britain, may be allowed their liberty. They will be compelled to remain in this country till the war is over. Those who are not willing to sign will be kept in custody till the end of the war.

Expressions of loyalty to the German emperor by a few of them led to the visit of the police and the arrest of the fifteen.
